
There are two ways to donate to the education building fund using FaithDirect for a donation.


Prison Ministry Jackie Castro

Migrant Worker Ministry Wayne Parent

One of the oldest ministries at St. Marys is the Migrant Worker ministry which records visits to the migrant worker camps during Father Hamlet's time as pastor in the 1989's. At present there are approximately 12 migrant camps in the Nelson County area housing upwards of 300 migrant workers at various times of the year. The ministry is a presence ministry attempting to reach as many of the workers as possible each year. We distribute donated clothes especially cold weather clothing, pray with them, distribute faith items, and Father celebrates mass at several of the camps each year. Our effort is well recognized as the diocese provides us with a financial grant each year which allays some costs. As well, several local parishes provide support to us as well. We distribute faith articles such as rosaries, bibles, prayer cards and holy water. We also purchase and distribute personal items such as gloves, socks, shampoo, soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, etc . If you want to help this large group of Catholics in our area, please contact Wayne Parent (571-477-5045, wcparent7@aol.com) or see Raquel in the office. We typically start with clothes distribution in late February and end the season with visits at Christmas time to camps with workers overwintering.
