Please consider donating **SWEATSHIRTS, COATS, GLOVES, HATS, TOWELS AND BLANKETS**. The need is great and if you don't have any articles from your own wardrobe consider buying some and donating them. Hooded sweatshirts are very useful for these workers. Three years ago we made our first visit at Christmas time to one camp with 6 guys who arrived 2 days before Christmas. Today the same camp just had 12 workers arrive to stay and work the winter. We know that we will visit at least three camps right before Christmas. Thanks in advance for your generosity. **Note** that all of these workers are here by themselves, so donations of women's or children's clothes are not sought or needed.

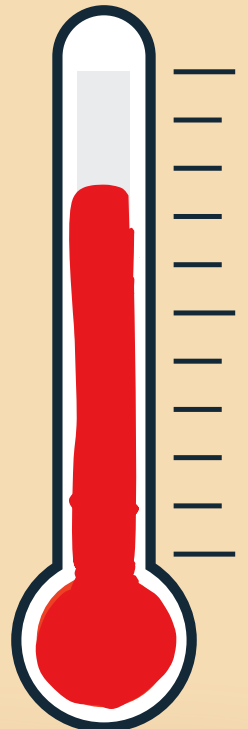

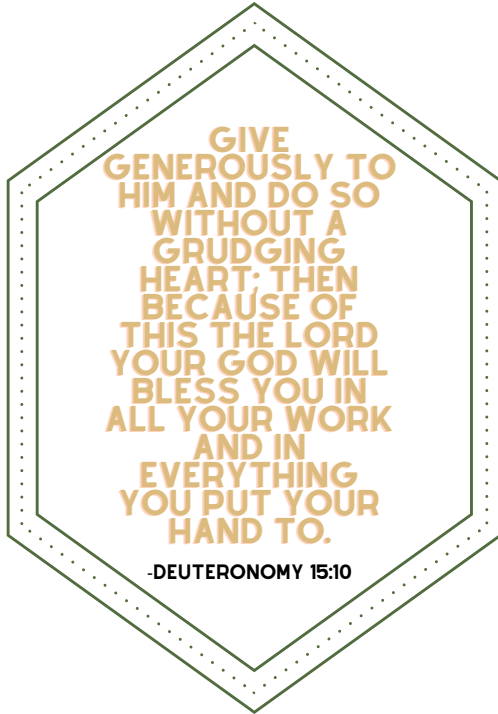


